In 2018 she led a cross-sector collaborative team between Guide Dogs, Microsoft, LNER and Pointr to deliver a successful DfT funded Innovate UK 'First of a Kind' project that created a proof of concept interoperable technology solution to provide people with sight loss a way to navigate from an outdoor to indoor station environment and onto a train using 3D spatial audio wayfinding technology and provided key evidence of social impact measures to the DfT.

Her work has been short listed twice for the Institute for Collaborative Working innovation awards and she leads the generation of the Third Sector Special Interest Group to enable more third sector organisations to benefit from professional relationship management frameworks.
